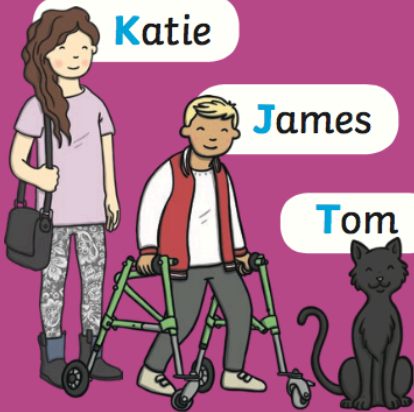

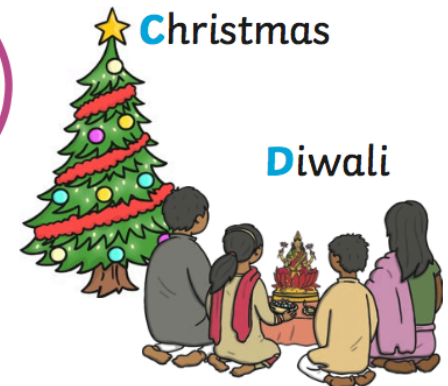

# Commas



**A comma separates units of meaning in a sentence.**

**A comma separates items in a list.**

Jenna bought some apples, grapes, bananas and pears for her fruit salad.



**A comma separates off a subordinate opening.**

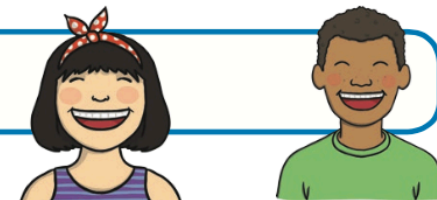
Although she was tired, Tilly went to the party.



Hint: a subordinate opening does not make sense on its own! It must be linked to the main sentence which includes a verb (action) and a subject (a person/thing doing the action).

**A comma marks out a relative clause (extra information that has been added into the sentence).**

The children, who were in class six, were very excited.





# Full Stops



Full stops are used to end a sentence.

My name is Ahmed.



Full stops are used when an abbreviation does not include the last letters of the full word.

'Sunday'  
becomes 'Sun.'



Full stops are used for abbreviations.

e.g.

Full stops are used in email addresses.
