A Message from Mr Smith

Brrrr! Winter has certainly arrived this week, but unfortunately the children have missed out on some of the snow-play fun happening in other areas of Yorkshire this week (I'm sure we'll get some good snow-sculpture building opportunities soon!) Please could you remind your children they have to wear their coats at break and lunch times. They may feel that they are warm enough in a jumper, but we don't want anyone to become unwell due to the ever-decreasing temperatures. **Named** scarves, hats and gloves are also greatly appreciated.

I have recently been informed by a concerned parent to alert school of Roblox; and that a vulnerable family member had fallen victim to an inappropriate adult user impersonating as a child. Therefore, I thought this was an appropriate opportunity to share information about how to help your children stay safe on this digital platform:

How to Keep Your Kids Safe on Roblox

The realm of Roblox is huge, and while it offers a universe of creativity and fun, every parent's top priority is their child's safety. The good news is that with the right tools and practices in place, it's completely possible for your children to have a safe and enjoyable experience on Roblox.

It's important that we as parents/carers recognise the potential risks of children using the service and the measures we can take to help our children enjoy a safe experience. Any online platform, especially those catering to younger audiences, can attract inappropriate individuals. Roblox does invest in safety protocols and has mechanisms like chat filters to reduce risks. However, the best defence is an informed child. Educate them about the dangers of sharing personal information and the importance of reporting any unsavory encounters and encourage open communication, so they can confide in you if something feels off.

There are several ways to make Roblox safe for your kids. Start by setting their account to their appropriate age category (All Ages, 9+, 13+, and 17+). Use Roblox's built-in parental controls, which include regulating chat functions and curating a list of approved games. Regularly discuss online safety and consider adding an extra layer of security with a parental control app to monitor your child's activity and screen time.

How to Keep Your Children Safe on Roblox

- 1. Install a Good Quality Parental Control App
- 2. Use Roblox's In-Built Parental Controls
- 3. Have Open Conversations About Online Safety
- 4. Set Ground Rules and Boundaries
- 5. Play Together
- 6. Ensure Digital Hygiene with Antivirus Software.

Roblox is secure, but external links or game downloads can sometimes carry threats. A reliable antivirus ensures your child doesn't fall for scams and accidentally download malware or fall prey to phishing schemes.

Administration of medication in school- reminder

If a child is feeling unwell and/or has a temperature then they should not attend the school setting. We follow the Local Authority's Policy for supporting children with medical conditions in school and the administration of prescribed and non-prescribed medication. We only administer medication when we have written parental permission to do so, as follows:-

- We administer medication in school when it is essential to do so and where not to do so would be detrimental to a child's health.
- We accept prescribed medication that has been prescribed by a doctor, dentist, nurse prescriber or pharmacist prescriber and is in-date, labelled and provided in the original container, as dispensed by the pharmacist, and include instructions for administration, dosage and storage. A school medication administration form must also be completed by the parent/carer and a record of administration form must be kept by staff.
- We do not accept non-prescribed medication unless it is absolutely essential to the child's health and where it cannot be administered out of the schools/settings hours. The medication must be in the original container including instructions for administration and dosages. A medication administration form must be completed by the parent/carer and a record of administration form must be kept by staff.
- Slingsby School treat non-prescribed medication the same as if it were prescribed i.e. checking the packaging, expiry date, dosage, administration instructions, correct storage etc.
- The school will accept insulin that is inside an insulin pen or pump rather than its original container, but it must be in date.
- We will not give Aspirin to any child under 16 unless it is prescribed.
- We do not hold our own stocks of medication.

Why is Attendance Important?

Every school day counts and every minute in our day is really valuable learning time. Being late and days off school add up to a lot of lost education and can affect achievement. There are 175 non-school days per year which is 175 days to spend on special family time, visits, holidays and other appointments. There are 190 days to learn and develop in school. This is the guidance we follow:
