ECO Committee Updates

The BIG BATTERY HUNT is a nationwide recycling challenge that inspires pupils to power change across their schools and wider communities. In 2024 the BIG BATTERY HUNT completed its 5th successful year and has managed so far to recycle over 18.4 million batteries! This initiative, run by Duracell, shows children that small environmental actions, when taken collectively, can make a big difference.

Batteries need to be recycled properly for several reasons. Firstly, they contain harmful chemicals that can be hazardous to humans and wildlife. Also, producing batteries involves mining the raw materials, many of these can be recovered during the recycling process and re-used. Up to 95% of battery components can be recovered for alternative use or may even be turned into new batteries.

So please help us by looking through your drawers and cupboards to find any used batteries which you haven't known what to do with and bring them in so that we can take them to be recycled. We have a container in the main entrance hall where children can drop in any household batteries including button batteries such as for watches. No leaking batteries please to keep the children safe. The children will be counting how many we get and will keep you updated on how we do. Help us reduce waste as we work towards gaining our Eco Schools Award AND do our bit to help the environment. We intend to have the collection point here permanently.

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RSPB Big Garden Bird Watch.

The Eco Committee would like to encourage you to take part in this weekend's Big Bird Watch. It only takes one hour of your time. It is the world's largest garden wildlife survey. Every year, hundreds of thousands of nature lovers like you take part, helping to build a picture of how garden birds are faring.
