I think we have definitely seen every weather event possible this week and the children have coped very well with dodging the hail storms and sleet showers!

During our celebration of World Book Day on Friday, we joined all the classes for a whole-school assembly in the morning. Then, in the afternoon, the children enjoyed making their own origami bookmarks. After break, the children chose an adult for a special story time in different locations: I thoroughly enjoyed reading one of my childhood favourite books (The Enormous Crocodile) to a group. The children then returned to their classes for our eco book swap: thank you very much for all your donations. A special 'Congratulations' to superstar Ted D in Class 3 for winning the NYES Catering World Book Day prize for his impressive manners in the dining hall on Friday.

The plans for our Volunteer Day on Saturday 29th March are underway lead by Mrs Breckon and Mrs Massey. They hope to plant at least eight tree saplings from the Woodland Trust to create a shaded orchard area on our top playground, build a new mud kitchen, erect a new bug hotel, tidy up our wildlife garden and plant some wildflower seeds and plants kindly donated by the Slingsby Village Produce Show Committee.
