A Message from Mr Smith

We are incredibly proud of the Eco School's "Distinction" Green Flag award we received at the end of last year and we are working hard to build on this. November is the National Eco Schools 'Cut your Carbon' month and your children will be bringing home a challenge leaflet in the coming days: 'Eco-Schools is once again inviting all schools, colleges, and nurseries to join our free carbon-cutting campaign, running throughout November. Last year, young people completed over 200,000 carbon-saving actions. This year, we're aiming even higher!'

In school we will be reinforcing the idea that everyone can make a difference to protecting our planet by making small changes to how we live, such as: remembering to turn lights off; keeping doors shut to retain heat; recycling responsibly and not wasting products or materials. We hope that as many of our families can engage with the challenges detailed on the leaflet/challenge sheet coming home this week, as your children will need your support to do so fully (ie: one challenge is to prepare 3 plant-based meals during November). Each child will receive 2 Eco Green Dojo points for completion of each challenge and a certificate will be awarded to all children who complete the 6 challenges and return their form signed off by a parent/carer before the end of November (more information below in the Eco Schools Update). Good luck!

Unfortunately, I am currently behind on our 'hot chocolate' rewards, but will be catching up with our Slingby Values award winners as soon as I can next week – they'll not miss out!

We are delighted that eight new Eco Champions have been nominated this year, two from each class. They will take part in regular meetings with Mrs Breckon to plan and encourage green actions across the school. Updates to follow.

November is Cut your Carbon Month. This is a nationwide campaign aimed at young people and their families to help tackle carbon emissions. By doing 6 simple and easy actions during November we can collectively make a difference. Many of the actions you may already be doing so simply tick those ones off! Forms will be going home this week.

This is what we are asking you to try:

Make three evening meals plant-based across the month

Meat production is responsible for around **14%** of the world's greenhouse gas emissions, so discover how delicious cutting carbon can be!

Make any three journeys 'active' across the month

Transport creates nearly a **quarter** of the UK's carbon emissions. Active travel - such as walking, scooting, wheeling, or cycling - doesn't emit anything! So, get active and ditch the drive!

Have a device-free day

Electricity makes up about **25%** of your home's carbon footprint. Power down non-essential devices for one day — no gaming, no streaming — and rediscover the joy of offline fun!

Meal plan to reduce food waste for one week

Research suggests that the average person wastes 95kg of food per year! At each stage of the life-cycle of wasted food, from production to rotting at landfill, carbon is produced. Plan your meals, shop smart, and waste less — it's good for the planet and your wallet!

Lower your washing machine temperature to 30°C for three washes across the month

Washing machines are energy-hungry! Drop the temperature to **30°C** for three washes this month and cut carbon without sacrificing clean clothes. Cool it to care!

Turn down the heating by 1°C for a week

Heating is the top source of home carbon emissions in the UK. Turn it down by just **1°C** for a week, layer up, and show your love for the planet — one cosy jumper at a time!

At the end of November simply bring back your forms so that our Champions can collect the data. It will also go towards us earning our Green Flag for this year. Who knows you may find that you carry on some of these ideas and make them a regular occurrence!

Procedure for Winter Weather/Unavoidable School Closure

We will always do all we can to ensure school remains open, but in the event that the winter weather prevents staff travelling into school, or we lose any utility functions, we will follow our *Unavoidable Closure Policy* which you were provided with in your starter pack and is available on our website. Outside of school hours, we aim to make a decision by 7:30am and will send you a text via our Teacher2Parents App by 8am. We will also send an email as soon as possible; inform Greatest Hits Radio who will broadcast the message; and inform the Local Authority who will post the information on their website.

Inside school hours, as well as the above, we will ring you or the contact you provided to us on your Unavoidable Closure Form to explain that school will be closing. If the contact details you provided to us have changed, please email the School Office.

Please remember that if it is snowing, the children may come to school in wellies or walking boots and should wear suitable coats, hats, gloves for playing out in the snow. They should also bring their school shoes in a labelled carrier bag so that footwear can be changed when in the classroom to avoid soaking the carpets (same for playing in the mud). If children do not have suitable clothing, unfortunately they will not be able to play in the snow.
