### A Message from Mr Smith

On Monday, pupils and staff welcomed Miss Dorland, a third year undergraduate Ripon and St. John University student who will be undertaking her final School Experience at Slingsby School. Miss Dorland will be working in Class Curie for 11 school weeks until 17<sup>th</sup> April 2026.

As part of our ongoing commitment to the safety, health, and wellbeing of our pupils, staff, and community, we would like to remind everyone about the importance of switching off car engines when stationary outside the school. Leaving your engine running while parked — known as *idling* — is not only harmful to the environment but is also against the law under the Highway Code (Rule 123) and the Road Traffic Act 1988. It can result in a fine if ignored. More importantly, idling produces unnecessary air pollution, which can be especially harmful to children's developing lungs. We kindly ask that when waiting to collect or drop off your child, you:

- Switch off your engine if you are stationary for more than a few seconds.
- Avoid parking in a way that blocks driveways or creates congestion.
- Help us keep the air around our school clean and safe for everyone.

By making this small change, we can all contribute to a healthier environment and set a positive example for our children. Thank you for your cooperation and continued support in making our school a safe and welcoming place for all.

## **Maypole Dancing Lessons for May Day – Open to KS2**

This forms part of the FOSS Scarecrow weekend which is always a big event for the school and village community. The classes will be led by Mrs Breckon from the village Maypole Committee, who is fully DBS checked and a regular supply teacher in school. There is space for a maximum of 16 children. Children who sign up will be asked to make sure they attend every lesson, wherever possible.
