A Message from Mr Smith

As you will be aware from the news, school budgets – especially for small rural schools - continue to shrink and we have to be incredibly careful with our expenditure.

Unfortunately, despite being a small rural school, we receive no funding for transportation costs to take the children outside of the village, which means we need to ask our families to contribute towards the cost of travel so that we can offer the wonderful experiences and extracurricular activities: this is detailed in every trip/visit letter we send out. We massively appreciate your donations, as they make such a difference to the range of extra-curricular activities and fantastic opportunities that Slingsby Community Primary School are able to offer our pupils.

We have been noticing a fall in contributions from families, and school has been regularly subsidising the shortfall between contributions received and the actual cost of the coaches, but sadly, we can no longer afford to do this. We are therefore going to have to start making some difficult decisions to cancel events if not enough contributions are received, and reduce the number of trips that take place during the year.

We fully appreciate that the cost of living is being felt in every walk of life and we will continue to do our very best to give the children as many opportunities as possible, within the confines of our budgets.

Despite the raging winds and rotten weather, the children continue to impress myself and staff with their hard-working attitude and kindness to others; although we are all looking forward to a bit of sunshine which hopefully will not be too far away!

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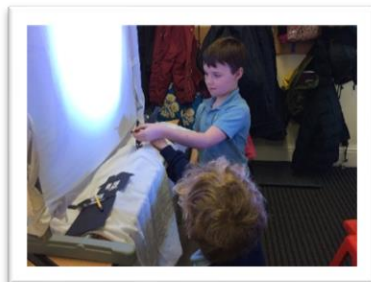
