A Message from Mr Smith

Last week, our magnificent team of Year 5 and Year 6 swimmers attended the annual local schools swimming gala at Norton swimming pool. Last year, Slingsby came back as the 'small school' victors (schools with fewer than 100 pupils); but this year they went one better and won the overall event: beating schools with MANY more pupils. This is a FANTASTIC result and we are so very proud of them all! Miss Secker has given more details of the event below.

This week, we have been taking time to focus on Children's Mental Health Week. In Class Curie, we looked at responsibly using social media to support healthy mental wellbeing and discussed the importance of being kind online in everything we write or comment on. In Class Gold, the children designed posters around belonging, where the children thought about places where they feel safe or people/groups they feel they belong with. Class Bolt did their morning warm-up routine to wake up their body and mind, setting a positive tone for the day ahead. They also made mosaics to show what belonging means to them. The children in Class Hamza made masks to show what makes them comfortable and confident.



Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 all took part in a Yoga lesson on Wednesday with Miss Leeming from Flow for All Yoga Studio where they learnt to stretch, take a moment of calm and different breathing exercises.

On Wednesday, my assembly focussed on being comfortable with who you are, but also showing respect and tolerance for people who choose to be different from the 'norm.' The main thing is, we should all be happy with being who we are, and not feel under pressure to be who people expect us to be in order to fit in.

To conclude the week, tomorrow is a non-uniform '*Come As Yourself Day*.' Children can wear an outfit which makes them feel most comfortable, confident, and like they truly belong — whether that's cosy clothes, cultural dress, favourite colours, or something totally unique!
